A facility will be provided for organisations and schools to book visits formally from January 2013. The Traffic Control Centre section will start a phased entry from late this year to be operational in early 2013.	Noted

4.2	EB provided presentation of works progress with project overview and look ahead – including: - photos showing extent of works (as at July) with verbal update on significant progress since then - M9 eastbound diverge – embankments complete, road surface to be applied soon - M9 westbound merge – almost complete, safety barriers to be introduced soon - loop – road surfacing to be complete by end of next week - southbound merge to M9 – almost complete with noise barriers to be erected by end of August (weather dependant) - M9 overbridge – 10 to 12 weeks for full completion - Newmains Bridge – framework/wall on south side is in place, aiming to pour concrete for north wall next Mon/Tue, complete works by November - Community liaison – further tidy-up works have been undertaken at Kirkliston Primary School and in supporting the environmental improvements by Pikes Pool volunteer Group. 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	 closures required Hard shoulder running to be retained until end of September Resurfacing works are planned for whole of M9 spur area from end of September for 8 consecutive weekends, this will involve overnight closures. LS emphasised this will be major works and advanced publicity will encourage motorists to avoid the area and find alternative routes. EB explained that this might extend to some overnight closures during Thursdays and Fridays. Post Meeting Note: The M9 and M9 Spur resurfacing works are now due to commence over 4 to 6 weekends commencing 5 Oct and will include overnight works during the week.

3.1	EM provided presentation of works progress with project overview and look ahead including: - photos showing extent of works - scope of works - project summary - foundations – including caissons (believed to be biggest open caissons ever used worldwide) and the installation process, including the temporary parts of caissons which are currently being fitted - connecting roads north and south – including new alignments for Ferrytoll Road, B981 and Castlandhill Road, railway overbridge for new B981 and Ferrytoll embankment (possibly the highest ever built in UK) - south compound offices are complete - testing of the cables is taking place in Germany. 	 On-going rock blasting (fortnightly) at Whinny Hill will continue for 2 months and will require a nighttime rolling road block on A90 (up to 30 minutes) along with Castlandhill Road closures for up to 1 hour and stopping traffic on B980 for up to 30 mins. Closure of the B981 is required for 10 mins to accommodate 3 further rock blasts at St Margaret's Hope (complete in 3 weeks) In September, Ferrytoll Road utility works will require temp traffic lights with one lane running. 	RD provided presentation of works progress with project overview and look ahead – including - photos showing extent of works - on-site works are largely complete - one cantilever gantry has been installed - the remaining gantry beams are being fitted out and tested, 5 will be installed at the end of August and then commissioned, the remainder (12) will be installed during September Post meeting note; Earliest gantry installation will now be 12 September - LS advised the bus lane will become operational following the gantry installation and subsequent	Noted

testing and commissioning. Information leaflets for the public and bus drivers are being produced to help explain the ITS and bus lane operation. - LS confirmed Fife Council's Halbeath Park & Ride project will begin construction at the end of August and is likely to take a year.	
Q What is a gantry base? A RD confirmed these are areas to accommodate the columns which the gantry beams are mounted on. They also include maintenance areas.	Noted
Q Will the bus lane remove the hard shoulder? A LS confirmed it will still be available as a hard shoulder for emergencies, in such circumstances any buses would be directed into the other lanes.	Noted
Q Query re likely bus routes and how Halbeath and Ferrytoll park & rides will operate? A LS expected buses would pick up at both destinations and then travel through to Edinburgh and destinations south of the Forth.	Noted
Q Query re size of buses being allowed in bus lane having been reduced from +28 to +24 seats? A LS confirmed this was the case and followed consultation with a number of stakeholders including Stagecoach.	Noted
Q Who will be responsible for maintaining embankment grass areas at Park Lea? A LS confirmed that Graham Construction is responsible for first 5 years and then Transport Scotland through its appointed maintenance contractor.	Noted
 RD highlighted issue re standing water at Park Lea which will be rectified.
