	Keith Brown visited the Queensferry Crossing construction site on August 13 to meet with workers and view progress on the project.	Noted
	Mr Brown updated media on the fact that the project now has peak employment rates with 1,200 employed directly onsite. He also mentioned the following:	
	<ul> <li>The south approach viaduct has been fully launched to its final position</li> <li>The first cables have been installed on the North Tower</li> <li>All three of Queensferry Crossing's towers are over 160 metres high – at least 10 metres above the height of the Forth Road Bridge</li> <li>The new B800 bridge over the A90 was opened in July</li> <li>Assembly of north approach viaduct is nearly complete ready for launch this autumn.</li> <li>Finally, with Queensferry Crossing's towers now at least 10 metres higher than the Forth Road Bridge Mr Brown was also able to announce that the Queensferry Crossing is the highest bridge in the UK.</li> </ul>	
3.4	Industry Days	
	The project held 20 'Industry Days' for engineering professionals to attend a half day event to find out more about the FRC Project which included a bus tour of the FRC site. The events took place between late April and mid-August. These were a huge success and attracted around 1000	Noted

	The FRC Communications Team launched the Frame the Bridge Campaign in March, the purpose of FTB is to create a mosaic of the Queensferry Crossing out of thousands of photographs.	Noted

<ul> <li>3.6 Contact and Education Centre (CEC) - Update CC provided a short update regarding the CEC Outreach and Education programme.</li> <li><u>FRC Project Exhibition</u> <ul> <li>There have been over 10,921 visitors to the Project Exhibition since it opened in 2013</li> <li>2,715 visitors have attended the Project Exhibition since it re-opened on 7 March 2015</li> </ul> </li> <li><u>FRC Talks and Presentations</u> <ul> <li>Over 14,000 people have attended a pre-booked presentation.</li> <li>Since the FRC Presentations Series re-commenced in March 688 people have attended these events. In total we have had approximately 1,450 attend the Presentation Series since these began in 2014.</li> </ul> </li> <li><u>FRC Schools Education Programme</u> <ul> <li>Approximately 9,000 pupils have attended a visit since the education programme commenced in 2013.</li> <li>We have introduced a new education programme for the 2015/16 academic year called 'Distance Learning'. RK elaborated on this, informing the Forum that the Distance Learning package for schools had been developed to enable teachers to deliver information about the Queensferry Crossing and the FRC Project to pupils who could not attend because of any prohibitive distance they would have to travel or the cost of transport.</li> </ul> </li> <li>LS summarised by stating that to date approximately 35,000 people have visited the CEC, attended an educational visit</li> </ul>	ed

4.1	LS provided a short update regarding FBOC and the FBF.	
	• Following the dissolution of FETA on 1st June 2015, Amey Highways Limited became responsible for the management and maintenance of the Forth Bridges Unit under Transport Scotland's Forth Bridges Operating Company Contract.	Noted
	• The Forth Bridges Unit comprises the Forth Road Bridge and the road network from M9 Junction 1A through to M90 Junction 3 at Halbeath plus the A823(M) Pitreavie Spur.	Noted

	<ul> <li>Once the Queensferry Crossing opens in late 2016, Amey will become the single operator for both road bridges.</li> </ul>	Noted

	• The Forth Bridge was inscribed as a World Heritage Site by United Nations body UNESCO in July 2015. The Forth Bridge becomes the sixth World Heritage Site in Scotland. The successful inscription of the Forth Bridge marks the culmination of over three years work since the UK Government's Department for Culture, Media and Sport announced a nomination would be prepared for the Forth Bridge. Since then, the Scottish Government - through the Forth Bridges Forum, working closely with community representatives - led the preparation and public consultation for the nomination.	Noted

5	Forth Crossing Bridge Constructors (Principal Contract)	
5.1	<ul> <li>EM provided a slide presentation to Forum members that included photos of the work currently on-going, progressing from south to north:</li> <li>Dalmeny Rail Bridge and Standingstane Road Bridge in Dalmeny - bridge repairs and waterproofing works have been carried out in preparation for the tie-in of the south bound bus link. A new vehicle safety barrier will be added in due course.</li> <li><u>B800 Bridge</u> – this was open fully to traffic in late July and the existing B800 bridge will be demolished over two weekends – the 24th and 31st October 2015, with 7th November weekend booked as a contingency. This will entail temporary closures of the A90. Details will be published in the media and the project website nearer the time.</li> <li>Approach Road South - Sub-base (the first construction layer of the new M90 motorway) is underway between Dundas and the new Queensferry Junction with work continuing over the next two months. Drainage and ducting are being installed along the motorway and shall be sufficiently advanced as the year progresses to see our target of blacktop surfacing in place from Dundas through to the South Abutment.</li> <li><u>Queensferry Junction</u> - Much of the work is now complete with verge works being progressing well with joiners and steel fixers having started the process of forming the deck to support the north bound carriageway. The first of 28 concrete pours is planned for September 2015 and work will be continuous into the early part of 2016 until 24 pours are completed by spring 2017. The final four pours</li> </ul>	Noted

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	will be completed after this to tie into the main crossing deck.	
	<ul> <li><u>Towers</u> –</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li><u>rowers</u> –</li> <li>South and North Towers are progressing well,</li> </ul>	
	cabling having started on the North Tower in	
	July and the South in August, with the first four	
	deck sections at each of these having being	
	successfully concreted during the past three months.	
	<ul> <li>Deck concreting on Central Tower is progressing well and cabling will get underway</li> </ul>	
	soon.	
	<ul> <li>Each tower requires 54 concrete pours . At</li> </ul>	
	present the South, Central and North have	
	completed 45, 45 and 47 pours respectively,	
	each one, on average 4 metres high.	
	North Annuage H (Sector) (NA) (Algebra the piece is	
	<ul> <li><u>North Approach Viaduct (NAV)</u> - Work on the piers is nearing completion in good time for the launching of</li> </ul>	
	the NAV steelwork, a 222 metre long structure	
	weighing in at over 6000 tonnes which will be pulled	
	over the North Abutment and piers to its final resting	
	place this autumn.	
	<u>Ferrytoll Viaduct</u> - Reinforced concrete work on the	
	deck is 40% complete with full completion scheduled	
	for early autumn. The adjacent embankments have	
	progressed well during 2015 with the bulk of the	
	required 1.2 million tonnes of imported spent oil	
	shale now in place. The earthworks for the SUDS	
	(Sustainable Urban Drainage Systems) Pond	
	immediately to the west of Ferrytoll viaduct is nearing	
	completion. The pond will be lined with an impervious	
	clay liner covered with 300mm of topsoil and planted	
	by spring of 2016.	
	<ul> <li><u>St Margaret's Marsh</u> - Works to improve irrigation and</li> </ul>	
	to promote the propagation of the marsh into the reed	
	bed area are nearing completion with the installation	
	of three sluice gates in the sea wall, refurbishment of	
	five sluice gates in the reed bed area and the	
	installation of connecting drainage throughout this	
	Site of Special Scientific Interest.	
	King Malcolm Drive/Ferrytoll Road/ B981 Junction -	
	works are nearing completion with full opening	
	including traffic lights planned for no later than	

	September 2015.	
	<ul> <li>Ferrytoll northbound merge slip road to the A90 - On</li> </ul>	
	Sunday 16th August 2015, this slip road off	
	Castlandhill Road was opened to traffic. This is the	
	first shift of traffic onto the new motorway alignment	
	on the north network. It will be followed by all four	
	lanes of traffic being shifted to their new, permanent,	
	alignment throughout the remainder of 2015 and into	
	2016.	
	<ul> <li>Average speed cameras (40mph) – from Echline to</li> </ul>	
	Admiralty are currently under test on the northbound	
	carriageway. Southbound carriageway cameras will	
	be installed later this year.	
	Roadworks North - The earthworks to the north of	
	Dunfermline Wynd adjacent to the northbound	
	carriageway are required to accommodate the new	
	northbound diverge and hard shoulder from the new	
	M90. The final slope of the cutting is now being	
	formed and roadworks will follow in this location later	
	in 2015.	
	<u>Ferrytoll Junction area</u> - The works at Ferrytoll are	
	highly complex – there are around 15 traffic	
	management phases to undertake before summer	
	2016. We are currently in Phase 5. Email alerts	
	relating to the works at Ferrytoll are being issued for	
	those who sign up for them at <u>www.frc-ferrytoll.info</u> .

6	Community issues	
	LC raised a number of issues brought to her attention	
	by residents of North Queensferry these were;	
6.1	Regarding the merging of the new northbound slip	
	road to the main A90 carriageway - some residents	
	of North Queensferry have commented that they	
	find it unsafe due to poor sightlines from the northbound traffic.	

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	EM acknowledged that there are shorter sight lines travelling northbound on the A90 nearing the junction, however, as the traffic is moving at a slower speed (40mph limit) the junction is safe. EM recognised that when the traffic is busy there are a lack of merging opportunities given the temporary 'give way' nature of the merge. However, the works adjacent to this area are being progressed such that an improved layout will be possible in a few weeks.	Noted
6.2	An issue with HGV's parking on Battery Road in North Queensferry. LC was asking for assurances that no HGV's would be parking in NQ and are not being diverted into NQ by FCBC. She would also like to know if there are any areas for HGV's to wait in out of normal delivery times.	
	EM confirmed that no HGV's should be parking on Battery Road and that FCBC were not diverting any into the area. EM asked that if any HGV's are seen parking in the area that the company name and registration of the vehicle be passed to FCBC to investigate.	Noted
6.3	Will the ICI be asking the community groups for feedback on the project anytime soon as a resident who lives on the west of the Forth Road Bridge has been experiencing excessive construction noise since the start of the project.	
	LS confirmed that the noise thresholds for the project, which were endorsed during the Parliamentary Bill process, are lower than the standards set out for most construction projects in the UK. All activities are subject to review by the Noise Liaison Group and FCBC are constantly monitoring noise levels, managing these well since the works began. Often the issue is that as some of the works take place over night the slightest noise can appear louder due to the lack of background noise. Liaison has been ongoing with the residents situated west of the FRB and FCBC has worked to ensure adherence in this and all areas.	Noted
6.4	WM asked whether the current works adjacent to the A90 and the average speed cameras on the northbound carriageway were affecting the traffic heading to Fife from Edinburgh?	
	LS advised that it was unlikely that the delays heading	

6.5	northbound had been caused by the average speed cameras but that the traffic flows had been heavier than normal, possibly due to the Edinburgh Festival. The Average Speed cameras have recently been installed and are currently under test. <b>BK raised an issue regarding the maintenance of Parklea Embankment and commented that this requires cutting.</b> TS will look into the maintenance regime and advise when this is next to take place.	Noted
