No recordings exceeded limits during December.  RD confirmed a question had been asked by resident if an existing hedge would act as a barrier and prevent accurate recording? This may be implemented from 1<sup>st</sup> Feb. Limited impact is anticipated.</li> <li>Essential resurfacing works due to take place at end of March/April (date tbc) will require further reconfiguration with some single lane running north and/or south at weekends. Queue monitoring equipment will be used but some delays are anticipated. The works involve reconstructing the south bound carriageway between the A92/M90 merge and Admiralty to extend its current life and support a bus lane.</li> <li>Community representatives highlighted this would have a major impact during school holidays in April, at the start of summer holidays, the Fife trade fortnight and during T-in-the-Park festival.</li> <li>LS confirmed these would be considered by the Traffic Management Group and details of the traffic management measures would be publicised well in advance.
