5.1	Progress update and 3 month look ahead	
	EM provided presentation of works progress with project overview and look ahead including: - photos showing extent of works - scope of works - main crossing - project summary - foundations – including caissons installation process - connecting roads north and south – including new Ferrytoll alignment and embankment - south compound offices are complete - Scottish Water – B800 diversion works will take place from Sept for 10 weeks and that letters have been issued to households. Phase 2 will take place in February 2013 Scottish Power diversions at Dundas and Echline Field are near complete - testing of the main crossing bridge stay cables is taking place in France - soil stripping and construction of noise bunds at Dundas Home Farm are to begin soon - soil stripping at South Queensferry gyratory will take 2 to 3 months and excavation work for the gyratory bridges will also commence - Existing B800 bridge will be demolished probably around Oct 2014, new bridge will be built to the west, the beams for which would likely be placed over a couple of weekends. 	Q DB asked if traffic from the new bridge will be able to access the B800?A EM confirmed it would, via the Queensferry gyratory.	Noted
	Q DB expressed concern that traffic wishing to avoid Newbridge might redirect via Kirkliston, increasing traffic congestion. DB also expressed concerns that problems of stationery traffic on M9 spur will simply be moved to	Noted

	Newbridge and this would encourage further "rat running" through Kirkliston. A LS explained that an updated Forth Public Transport Strategy has recently been published (on the project website) and the issue at Newbridge has been identified. Steps are being taken to consider how buses could transit across the junction and access the motorway more efficiently and this might also benefit other traffic. In general terms the new slip roads at M9 J1a would assist in redirecting traffic and the widening of the M9 south of J1a, together with the ITS system would also improve traffic flows, assisting Kirkliston.	
5.2	 Traffic management EM presentation covered: On-going rock blasting (fortnightly) at Whinny Hill will continue for 2 months and will require a nighttime rolling road block on A90 (up to 30 minutes) along with Castlandhill Road closures for 1 hour and stopping traffic on B980 for 30 mins. Closure of the B981 is required for 10 mins to accommodate further rock blasts at St Margaret's Hope (complete in 2 weeks) In September, Ferrytoll Road utility works will require temp traffic lights with one lane running. 	 EB provided presentation of works progress with project overview and look ahead – including: photos showing extent of works (as at 6th July) with verbal update on significant progress since then east bound diverge – embankments complete, road surface to be applied following period to allow for any settlement west bound merge – pavement substantially complete, safety barriers and signage to be introduced soon new part of loop – earthworks and pavement complete southbound merge to M9 – framework for noise barriers in place, barrier to be largely complete by end of Aug M9 overbridge – 10 to 12 weeks for full completion (i.e. end of Nov) 	Noted

6.2	Traffic Management EB provided presentation of traffic measures including: - M9 overbridge – some intermittent overnight closures are required for painting of beams etc - Overton Road Bridge – EB explained that the road closure was extended due to delays in utility works and SRB is aiming to re-open the road by mid-September (definitely in October)	Noted
	Q Query re inconvenience for residents (wanting to use Overton Road Bridge)? A EB confirmed SRB is dealing with issues on a case by case basis. Diversion route is through Winchburgh and is difficult if walking. Previously residents had been escorted through the site, but this service was stopped due to safety concerns given the nature of the ongoing works. A taxi service has been arranged for one resident. 	 Newmains Bridge – EB supplied leaflet notice. Requires very short road closures (holding traffic for 10 to 15 mins – maximum of 30 mins) on 30th (also possibly 31st) August to allow lifting of beams, between 9.30am and 3.30pm and possibly after 7pm. EB confirmed notices will be put up at the traffic signals at the bridge site and the leaflet also handed out in Winchburgh and to taxi drivers. DW confirmed CEC would be installing portable electronic signage in next 2 days plus discussions are taking place with First Bus to ensure buses get through before closures 	Noted

LS outlined benefits of Echelon process including low noise and longer life as it avoids joints.
