# The A9 Trunk Road (Poles to The Mound) (50mph Speed Limit) Order 2014

Made - - - - - Coming into force - -

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 84(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section  $84(2)(\mathbf{b})$  of that Act, they have given public notice of their intention to make this Order, and have complied with Parts II and III of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987( $\mathbf{c}$ ).

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A9 Trunk Road (Poles to The Mound) (50mph Speed Limit) Order 2014 and comes into force on

#### Speed restriction

**2.** No person may drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

**3.** No speed restriction imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.

#### SCHEDULE

#### SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso – Trunk Road from a point (at Ordnance Map coordinates 278116, 892641) at Poles, 143 metres or thereby south of its junction with the B9168 Poles Road, being the meeting point of the centreline of that trunk road and the extended centre line of the B9168 Poles Road, generally northwards, to a point (at Ordnance Map coordinates 276980, 897770) at the Mound, 978 metres or thereby southwest of its junction with the extended centre line of the A839 Mound to Lairg road, at the Mound, a distance of 6.382 kilometres or thereby.

# Statement of The Scottish Ministers' Reasons for Applying a Maximum Speed Limit of 50mph on the Section of the A9 Poles to The Mound

Following completion of the Speed Limit Review, Scottish Ministers are satisfied that a 50 mph Speed Limit be imposed on the A9 Trunk Road from Poles to The Mound to improve road safety. The 50 mph speed limit is consistent with other similar routes and is appropriate to the function and nature of the road. THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS hereby give notice that they propose to make the above Order under section 84(2)(b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which will have the effect of imposing a 50 mph speed limit on that length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso – Trunk Road from a point (at Ordnance Map coordinates 278116, 892641) at Poles, 143 metres or thereby south of its junction with the B9168 Poles Road, being the meeting point of the centreline of that trunk road and the extended centre line of the B9168 Poles Road, generally northwards, to a point (at Ordnance Map coordinates 276980, 897770) at the Mound, 978 metres or thereby southwest of its junction with the extended centre line of the A839 Mound to Lairg road, at the Mound, a distance of 6.382 kilometres or thereby.
