The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 84(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 84(2)(b) of that Act, they have given public notice of their intention to make this Order, and have complied with Parts II and III of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(c).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A82 Trunk Road (Glen Gloy junction to Letterfinlay Lodge) (50mph Speed Limit) Order 2014 and comes into force on [xx]

Speed restriction

2. No person may drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Exemption

3. No speed restriction imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(d) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.

SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A82 Dalnottar to Inverness Trunk Road from a point (at Ordnance Map coordinates 222158, 786270) 157 metres or thereby southwest of the extended centre line of the junction with the unclassified U1027 to Glen Gloy to a point (at Ordnance Map coordinates 225133, 791314) 268 metres or thereby northeast of the point where it meets the extended eastern gable of Letterfinlay Lodge Hotel, a distance of 6.152 kilometres or thereby.

THE A82 TRUNK ROAD (GLEN GLOY JUNCTION TO LETTERFINLAY LODGE) (50 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2014

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they propose to make the above Order under section 84(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This will have the effect of imposing a 50mph speed limit on that length of the A82 Dalnottar to Inverness Trunk Road from a point 157 metres or thereby southwest of the extended centre line of the junction with the unclassified U1027 to Glen Gloy to a point 268 metres or thereby northeast of the point where it meets the extended eastern gable of Letterfinlay Lodge Hotel, a distance of 6.152 kilometres or thereby.

Following completion of the Speed Limit Review, Scottish Ministers are satisfied that a 50mph Speed Limit be imposed on the A82 Trunk Road from Glen Gloy junction to Letterfinlay Lodge to improve road safety.
