The M80 (Castle Cary Interchange) Special Road Scheme

The Scottish Ministers make the following Scheme in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 7, 8(2) and 10(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 7(7) of that Act, they have given due consideration to the requirements of local and national planning, and to the requirements of agriculture and industry and are satisfied as to expediency.

They have determined that the project falls within Annex II to the Directive 2011/92/EU of the European Parliament and the Council(b) on the assessment of certain public and private projects on the environment, but is not a relevant project within the meaning in sections 20A and 55A of that Act(c) and should not be made subject to an environmental impact assessment in accordance with the Directive.

This Order is made in compliance with the provisions of Parts II and III of Schedule 1(d) to the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984.

Citation and commencement

1. This Scheme may be cited as the M80 (Castle Cary Interchange) Special Road Scheme 201[] and comes into force on [].

Special Road

2. The Scottish Ministers, as special road authority are, by means of this Scheme, authorised to provide a special road along the route described in the Schedule to this Scheme and such road shall become trunk road on the date this Scheme comes into force.

Classes of Traffic

3. Classes I and II of the classes of traffic set out in Schedule 3 to the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 are prescribed for the purpose of the use of the special road, the route of which is described in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

INTERPRETATION

In this Schedule—

“the plan” means the plan numbered M80/SRS/1 and entitled “The M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road Scheme 201[]”, signed with reference to this Scheme and deposited at the offices of Transport Scotland, Trunk Road and Bus Operations, Buchanan House, 58 Port Dundas Road, Glasgow, G4 0HF; and

“point 1” means the northern-most corner of the existing building known as Castlecary House Hotel, Castlecary Road, Cumbernauld, Glasgow, G68 0HD, shown marked “point 1” on the plan.

THE ROUTE OF THE SPECIAL ROAD

From a point 260 metres or thereby north-east of point 1 in a generally north, north-easterly direction for a distance of 55 metres or thereby to a point 310 metres or thereby north-east of point 1 as shown by a heavy black line between points marked “point A” and “point B” on the plan.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Scheme)

This Scheme at paragraph 2 authorises the Scottish Ministers, as special road authority, to provide a special road along the route described in the Schedule at Castlecary Interchange.

Paragraph 3 prescribes which classes of traffic are permitted to use the special road.

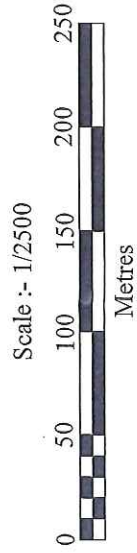
LEGEND

The M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road (Transfer and Side Road) Order 201[]

Made - - - - 201[]

Coming into force - - 201[]

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 9(1)(b) and (c) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them in that behalf.

In accordance with section 9(3) of that Act, they are satisfied that another reasonably convenient route is available before any road is stopped up pursuant to this Order.

They have determined that the project falls within Annex II to the Directive 2011/92/EU of the European Parliament and the Council(b) on the assessment of certain public and private projects on the environment, but is not a relevant project within the meaning in sections 20A and 55A(c) of that Act and should not be made subject to an environmental impact assessment in accordance with the Directive.

This Order is made in compliance with the provisions of Parts I and III of Schedule 1(d) to the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road (Transfer and Side Road) Order 201[] and comes into force on [].

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“the plan” means the plan numbered M80/TSR/1 and entitled “The M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road (Transfer and Side Road) Order 201[]”, signed with reference to this Order and deposited at the offices of Transport Scotland, Trunk Road and Bus Operations, Buchanan House, 58 Port Dundas Road, Glasgow, G4 0HF; and

“Castlecary House Hotel” means the building known as Castlecary House Hotel, Castlecary Road, Cumbernauld, Glasgow, G68 0HD.

Transferred Road

3. The Scottish Ministers specify that the length of road referred to in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order, being the length comprised in the route of the special road prescribed by the M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road Scheme 201[], shall be transferred to them as special road authority on the date of opening of that special road for use as a special road.

Side roads

4. The Scottish Ministers as special roads authority are authorised to stop up the length of road described in Part 2 of the Schedule.

Statutory Undertakers

5. Where immediately before the date this Order comes into force there is under, in, on, over, along or across the length of road described in Part 2 of the Schedule any apparatus belonging to a statutory undertaker, any rights of the statutory undertaker in respect of such apparatus shall be preserved.

Article 3

PART 1

THE ROUTE OF THE TRANSFERRED ROAD

From a point 260 metres or thereby north-east of the northern-most corner of Castle Cary House Hotel in a generally north, north-easterly direction for a distance of 55 metres or thereby to a point 310 metres or thereby north-east of the northern-most corner of Castle Cary House Hotel as shown by a heavy black line and numbered "1" on the plan.

PART 2

Article 4

LENGTH OF ROAD TO BE STOPPED UP

From a point 275 metres or thereby north-east of the northern-most corner of Castle Cary House Hotel in a generally easterly direction for a distance of 20 metres or thereby to a point 290 metres or thereby north-east of the northern-most corner of Castle Cary House Hotel, as shown by zebra hatching and numbered "2" on the plan.

THE M80 (CASTLECARY INTERCHANGE) SPECIAL ROAD SCHEME 201[]

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Scottish Ministers propose to make the following Orders:

1. The M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road Scheme 201[] under sections 7, 8(2) and 10(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, in connection with improving part of the M80 Glasgow – Stirling Trunk Road to the north of Castlecary, North Lanarkshire by upgrading the existing Castlecary Junction on the M80 northbound carriageway.

The general effect of the Scheme will be to provide a new section of special road on the existing M80 Castlecary northbound junction for all suitable classes of vehicles travelling northbound on Castlecary Road (B816).

2. The M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road (Transfer and Side Road) Order 201[] under sections 9(1)(b) and (c) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, in connection with improving part of the M80 Glasgow – Stirling Trunk Road to the north of Castlecary, North Lanarkshire by upgrading the existing Castlecary Junction on the M80 northbound carriageway.

The general effect of the Order will be to stop up the existing Castlecary Junction bus gate escape lane and to transfer the road provided in The M80 (Castlecary Interchange) Special Road Scheme 201[] to the Scottish Ministers as special roads authority.
