**The A82 Trunk Road (Drumnadrochit to Fort Augustus)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

Made - - - - 19th June 2014

Coming into force - - 28th June 2014

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 14(1)(b) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) (“the Act”) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(b) of the Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited because of the likelihood of danger to the public, or of serious damage to the road which is not attributable to works.

In accordance with section 14(3) of the Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A82 Trunk Road (Drumnadrochit to Fort Augustus) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014, comes into force on 28th June 2014 and ceases to have effect on 16th July 2014.

Temporary prohibition on use of vehicles

2. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road, or part or parts of the length of road, specified in the Schedule to this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or part or parts of that length of road, by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46) and S.I. 1999/1750.

Exemption

3. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to:—

- (a) any vehicles being used to transport an abnormal load comprising an electrical transformer;
- (b) any vehicle required to escort the vehicles transporting the abnormal load;
- (c) a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A82 Dalnottar – Inverness Trunk Road from its junction with the A831 road to Milton at Drumnadrochit, southwards to the unclassified access road to Ardochy House, north of Fort Augustus, a distance of 30.958 kilometres or thereby.

PRESS NOTICE

THE A82 TRUNK ROAD (DRUMNADROCHIT TO FORT AUGUSTUS) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2014

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily prohibiting traffic on that length of the A82 Dalnottar - Inverness Trunk Road from its junction with the A831 Road to Milton at Drumnadrochit, southwards to the unclassified access road to Ardochy House, north of Fort Augustus, a distance of 30.958 kilometres or thereby.

The Order is required to facilitate the transportation of an electrical transformer along this route. The Order will be in effect from 28 June 2014 to 16 July 2014, however it will only be in operation when and where appropriate signage has been erected. The anticipated date for these movements on the A82 is 29 June 2014. The transportation vehicles will be escorted by traffic management vehicles and Police Scotland.

There is no alternative route for traffic affected by this Order.
