ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A83 Trunk Road (Inveraray) (Temporary Prohibition On
Use of Road) Order 2015**

Made - - - -

22nd April 2015

Coming into force - -

3rd May 2015

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 16A(2) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event and enabling members of the public to watch that relevant event.

In accordance with section 16A(3) of that Act, they are satisfied that it is not reasonably practicable for the event to be held otherwise than on a road.

In accordance with section 16A(8) of that Act, they have had regard to the safety and convenience of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A83 Trunk Road (Inveraray) (Temporary Prohibition On Use of Road) Order 2015, comes into force on 3rd May 2015 and ceases to have effect on 4th May 2015.

Prohibition on use of vehicles

2. No person may use or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road, or a part or parts of the length of road, specified in the Schedule to this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (inserted by the 1991 Act Schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by S.I. 2001/1400) as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c.54) (relevantly amended by S.I. 2001/1400). The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

Exemptions

3. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to—

- (a) a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes; or
- (b) a vehicle being used for facilitating the holding of the relevant event.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A83 Tarbet – Lochgilphead – Campbeltown Trunk Road from its junction with Church Square, Inveraray in a northerly then north easterly direction along that part of the trunk road known as Main Street East and then in a north westerly direction along that part of the trunk road known as Front Street West to its junction with the entrance to Inveraray Castle, a distance of 310 metres or thereby.

PRESS NOTICE

THE A83 TRUNK ROAD (INVERARAY) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION ON USE OF ROAD) ORDER 2015

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily prohibiting traffic on that length of the A83 Tarbet – Lochgilphead – Campbeltown Trunk Road from its junction with Church Square, Inveraray in a northerly then north easterly direction along that part of the trunk road known as Main Street East and then in a north westerly direction along that part of the trunk road known as Front Street West to its junction with the entrance to Inveraray Castle, a distance of 310 metres or thereby.


The Order, which is required to facilitate the Inveraray Jail Break Race 2015 and to enable members of the public to watch the event, will be in operation from 1000 hours until 1200 hours on 3rd May 2015. Restrictions on the trunk road will only be in operation for approximately 10 minutes during these times. The Order does not apply to vehicles while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or to acts done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTES

An alternative route for traffic during the prohibition is not required.
