ROAD TRAFFIC

The A84 Trunk Road (Callander) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrians and Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2014

Made -

12th September 2014

Coming into force -

29th September 2014

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1), (2) and (3), 4(1) and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near that length of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

In accordance with section 14(1A) of that Act, they have consulted with the affected National Park(b).

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A84 Trunk Road (Callander) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrians and Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2014, comes into force on 29th September 2014 and ceases to have effect on 28th November 2014.

Prohibition on use of road

2. No pedestrian may use, or permit the use of, the lengths of road, or part or parts of the lengths of road, specified in the Schedule to this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or part of parts of that length of road, by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagrams 625.1, 7010.1, 7018 and 7105.

Prohibition on waiting, loading and unloading

3. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle to wait, load or unload on the lengths of road, or a part or parts of the length of road, specified in the Schedule to this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagrams 636 and 636.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

Exemptions

- 4. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to-
 - (a) a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes; or
 - (b) a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

Articles 2 and 3

SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

- 1. That length of the A84/A85 Stirling Crianlarich Trunk Road, on its north side, from its junction with Bracklinn Road, Callander, westwards to its junction with North Church Street, Callander, a distance of 320m or thereby.
- 2. That length of the A84/A85 Stirling Crianlarich Trunk Road, on its south side, from the access to the Roman Camp Hotel, Callander, to its junction with South Church Street, Callander, a distance of 340m or thereby.

THE A84 TRUNK ROAD (CALLANDER) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF PEDESTRIANS AND WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING) ORDER 2014

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily prohibiting pedestrians along the footway and also vehicles from waiting, loading or unloading on that length of the A84/A85 Stirling – Crianlarich Trunk Road on its north side from its junction with Bracklinn Road, Callander westwards to its junction with North Church Street, Callander, a distance of 320m or thereby, and on its south side from the access to the Roman Camp Hotel, Callander to its junction with South Church Street, Callander, a distance of 340m or thereby.

This Order, which is required because works are being, or are proposed to be, executed on or near the said length of road, namely the footway, will be in operation from 29 September 2014 until 28 November 2014 but will only have effect in relation to such part or parts of the length of road as is indicated by the appropriate traffic signs. The Order does not apply to works vehicles or vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes.
