ROAD TRAFFIC

The A96 Trunk Road (Newtongarry) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2012

Made - - -

23rd March 2012

Coming into force -

2nd April 2012

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1(1)(a), 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 1(1)(a) of that Act, they consider it expedient to do so for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A96 Trunk Road (Newtongarry) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2012 and comes into force on 2 April 2012.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. No person shall use, or cause or permit the use of, any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule.

Exemptions

- 3. No provision of this Order shall apply to—
 - (a) a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (b) anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

PART 1

That length of the existing carriageway of the A96 Aberdeen – Inverness Trunk Road, from a point 807 metres or thereby south east of the point of intersection of the trunk road and the projected centre line of the existing Bogside of Adamston Farm access to a point 367 metres or thereby north west of the point of intersection of the trunk road and the projected centre line of the existing C66S road to Insch, a distance of 591 metres or thereby.

PART 2

- 1. All right turns from the existing eastbound layby opening onto the westbound carriageway of the A96 Aberdeen Inverness Trunk Road.
- **2.** All right turns from the westbound carriageway of the A96 Aberdeen Inverness Trunk Road into the existing eastbound layby opening.
- **3.** All right turns from the existing westbound layby opening onto the eastbound carriageway of the A96 Aberdeen Inverness Trunk Road.
- **4.** All right turns from the eastbound carriageway of the A96 Aberdeen Inverness Trunk Road into the existing westbound layby opening.
