ROAD TRAFFIC

The A90 Trunk Road (A932 Lochlands Junction, Forfar) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) (No.2) Order 2010

Made Coming into force 12th November 2010 26th November 2010

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) and 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 1(1) of that Act, they consider it expedient to do so for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

They have complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A90 Trunk Road (A932 Lochlands Junction, Forfar) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) (No.2) Order 2010 and comes into force on 26th November 2010.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. Subject to Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall use, or cause or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule.

Permission or direction of Police Constable

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Exemption for emergency vehicles

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

Revocation of previous Order

5. The A90 Trunk Road (A932 Lochlands Junction)(Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2010(a) is revoked

SCHEDULE

PART 1

That length of the M90/A90 Inverkeithing – Fraserburgh Trunk Road at A932 Lochlands Junction, Forfar from a point 2 metres or thereby south of the extended south kerb line at A932 Dundee Road junction, to a point 8 metres or thereby north of the extended south kerb line at A932 Dundee Road junction, a distance of 10 metres or thereby.

PART 2

- 1. All right turns from the A932 Dundee Road northwards to the A90 trunk road.
- 2. All manoeuvres across the length of the M90/A90 Inverkeithing Fraserburgh Trunk Road from the A932 Dundee Road westwards to the private access road to Loanhead.

THE A90 TRUNK ROAD (A932 LOCHLANDS JUNCTION, FORFAR) (PROHIBITION OF SPECIFIED TURNS) (NO.2) ORDER 2010

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS hereby give notice that they have made the above Order and revoked The A90 Trunk Road (A932 Lochlands Junction)(Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2010 under sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) and 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to prohibit traffic on that length of the M90/A90 Inverkeithing – Fraserburgh Trunk Road at A932 Lochlands Junction, Forfar from a point 2 metres or thereby south of the extended south kerb line at A932 Dundee Road junction, to a point 8 metres or thereby north of the extended south kerb line at A932 Dundee Road junction, a distance of 10 metres or thereby from making any of the following turns:

- 1. All right turns from the A932 Dundee Road northwards to the A90 trunk road.
- 2. All manoeuvres across the length of the M90/A90 Inverkeithing Fraserburgh Trunk Road from the A932 Dundee Road westwards to the private access road to Loanhead.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTES

- 1. From A932 Dundee Road along Dundee Loan, then along A929 Glamis Road onto A90.
- 2. From Lochlands Junction on A90 trunk road continue southwards to Douglastown Grade Separated Junction and then return northwards on A90 to the Loanhead private access road.

The effect of the Order is as described in Notice 1501/215 in the Edinburgh Gazette, Issue Number 26611 and the Dundee Courier and Advertiser published 3rd April 2009 is modified to the extent that certain restrictions have been removed as a consequence of objections raised.

This Order revokes the A90 Trunk Road (A932 Lochlands Junction, Forfar) (Prohibition Of Specified Turns) Order 2010 notice of which was published in the Edinburgh Gazette, Issue Number 26856 and the Dundee Courier on Friday 22nd October 2010.
