ROAD TRAFFIC

The M9/A90/M90 Trunk Road (North Anderson Drive, Aberdeen (Prohibition of U-Turns) Order 2012

Made - - - - 2nd August 2012

Coming into force - - 13th August 2012

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1)(a), 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 1(1)(a) of that Act, they consider it expedient to do so for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the M9/A90/M90 Trunk Road (North Anderson Drive, Aberdeen) (Prohibition of U-Turns) Order 2012 and comes into force on 13th August 2012.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. No person may use, or cause or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule.

Exceptions

- 3. No provision of this Order applies to—
 - (a) a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes; or

Article 2

PART 1

That length of the M9/A90/M90 Edinburgh - Fraserburgh Trunk Road from a point 104 metres or thereby north of the Kings Cross Roundabout, North Anderson Drive, Aberdeen, to a point 472 metres or thereby north of the Kings Cross Roundabout, North Anderson Drive, Aberdeen, a distance of 368 metres or thereby.

PART 2

- 1. U-turns through the gaps in the central reservation opposite the junctions providing access into and out of—
 - (a) Grampian Fire and Rescue Service Headquarters;
 - (b) Maryville Park;
 - (c) Maryville Place; and
 - (d) Kingshill Road.

The effect of the Order is as described in the Aberdeen Press & Journal dated 17th February 2012 and the Edinburgh Gazette Issue Number 27058 dated 21st February 2012. The Order comes into force 13th August 2012.
