**The A82 Trunk Road (Aberchaldler Bridge) (Temporary
Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and of all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with Section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near that length of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A82 Trunk Road (Aberchaldler Bridge) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013, comes into force on 10th February 2013 and ceases to have effect on 31st March 2013.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. No person shall use or permit the use of any vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule when such a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (inserted by the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991, Schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by the S.I. 2001/1400) as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c.54). The functions of the Secretary of State, in so far as they are exercisable within devolved competence, were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by virtue of section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46) and S.I. 1999/1750.

Exemptions

3. No prohibition imposed by virtue of Article 2 of this Order applies to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

That length of the A82 Dalnoftar – Inverness Trunk Road from a point 4.029 kilometres or thereby north of its junction with the A87 Invergarry – Kyle of Lochalsh – Borve – Uig Trunk Road at Invergarry northwards to its junction with the private access road to Aberchalder Lodge, a distance of 689 metres or thereby.

PRESS NOTICE

THE A82 TRUNK ROAD (ABERCHALDER BRIDGE) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2013

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily prohibiting traffic on that length of the A82 Dalnottar - Inverness Trunk Road from a point 4.029 kilometres or thereby north of its junction with the A87 Invergarry – Kyle of Lochalsh – Boive – Uig Trunk Road at Invergarry northwards to its junction with the private access road to Aberchalder Lodge, a distance of 689 metres or thereby.

The Order, which is required to facilitate bridge works by implementing a maximum width restriction of 3 metres, will be in operation from 10th February 2013 until 31st March 2013 and will only have effect in relation to such length of road as is indicated by the appropriate traffic signs. The Order does not apply to vehicles while being used in connection with the placing of the required signage or vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or to acts done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Alternative routes for the traffic during the prohibition will be signposted. Detailed descriptions can be obtained at Scotland TransServ, Broxden House, Broxden Business Park, Lamberkine Park, Perth, PH1 1RA.
