ROAD TRAFFIC

The A830 Trunk Road (Craigag Bridge) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2) and, 4(1) and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(**a**) ("the Act") and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of the Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near that length of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of the Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A830 Trunk Road (Craigag Bridge) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012, comes into force on 11th June 2012 and ceases to have effect on 16th June 2012.

Temporary prohibition on use of vehicles

2. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road, or part or parts of a length of road, specified in the Schedule when a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or part or parts of that length of road, by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(**b**).

Exemption

3. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes or a vehicle while being used for carrying out the works.

Article 2

That length of the A830 Fort William - Mallaig Trunk Road from its access junction to the Glenfinnan House Hotel, eastwards to a point one kilometre or thereby east of the Craigag Lodge, a distance of 3.97 kilometres or thereby.

PRESS NOTICE

THE A830 TRUNK ROAD (CRAIGAG BRIDGE) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2012

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily prohibiting the use of vehicles on that length of the A830 Fort William - Mallaig Trunk Road from its access junction to the Glenfinnan House Hotel, eastwards to a point one kilometre or thereby east of the Craigag Lodge, a distance of 3.97 kilometres or thereby.

The Order, which is required because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the road in order to lay a new water main at Craigag Bridge, will be in operation from the 11th June 2012 until the 16th June 2012 but will only have effect in relation to such length of road as is indicated by the appropriate traffic signs.

The Order does not apply to vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance, or police purposes or a vehicle while being used to carry out the works.

There is no alternative route for traffic affected by this Order and as such the road will be open for a ten minute period at 00:00 hours, 02:00 hours and 04:00 hours each night.
