ROAD TRAFFIC

The A85 Trunk Road (Oban) (Temporary Prohibitions) Order
2012

Made - - - -

1st November 2012

Coming into force - -

11th November 2012

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that traffic on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near those lengths of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A85 Trunk Road (Oban) (Temporary Prohibitions) Order 2012, comes into force on 11th November 2012 and ceases to have effect on 31st December 2012.

Temporary prohibition on use of a road

2. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on a length of road, or a part or parts of a length of road, specified in the Schedule to this Order when such a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

Temporary prohibition on overtaking

3.—(1) No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle in such a way that it overtakes any other moving vehicle on a length of road, or a part or parts of a length of road, specified in the Schedule when such a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts

of that length of road, by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 632 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

(2) "Other moving vehicle" does not include a cycle, motor cycle, tricycle or any other vehicle not being a motor vehicle in accordance with section 140 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a).

Temporary prohibition on waiting and loading

4. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle to wait, load or unload on a length of road, or a part or parts of a length of road, specified in the Schedule when such a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagrams 636 and 636.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

Temporary prohibition of pedestrians

5. Pedestrians are prohibited from using a length of road, or a part of parts of a length road, specified in the Schedule when such a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagrams 7010.1 and 625.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002.

Exemptions

6. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to:

- (a) a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for carrying out the works; or
- (c) anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

SCHEDULE

Articles 2, 3, 4 and 5

1. That length of the A85 Tynndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as George Street, from its junction with Airds Place, Oban, northwards to its junction with Breadalbane Street, Oban, a distance of 534 metres or thereby.
2. That length of the A85 Tynndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as Corran Esplanade, from its junction with George Street, Oban, northwards to its junction with Dunollie Road west Roundabout, Oban, a distance of 463 metres or thereby.
3. That length of the A85 Tynndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as Stafford Street, from its junction with George Street, Oban, westwards to its junction with Corran esplanade, Oban, a distance of 54 metres or thereby.
4. That length of the A85 Tynndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as Dunollie Road, from its junction with Breadalbane Street, Oban, northwards to its junction with Dunollie Road East Roundabout, Oban, a distance of 205 metres or thereby.

THE A85 (OBAN) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITIONS) ORDER 2012

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily prohibiting traffic and pedestrians on:

That length of the A85 Tyndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as George Street, from its junction with Airds Place, Oban, northwards to its junction with Breadalbane Street, Oban, a distance of 534 metres or thereby.

That length of the A85 Tyndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as Corran Esplanade, from its junction with George Street, Oban, northwards to its junction with Dunollie Road west Roundabout, Oban, a distance of 463 metres or thereby.

That length of the A85 Tyndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as Stafford Street, from its junction with George Street, Oban, westwards to its junction with Corran esplanade, Oban, a distance of 54 metres or thereby.

That length of the A85 Tyndrum – Oban Trunk Road, known as Dunollie Road, from its junction with Breadalbane Street, Oban, northwards to its junction with Dunollie Road East Roundabout, Oban, a distance of 205 metres or thereby.

The Order, which is required because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near those lengths of road to allow essential road resurfacing to take place, will be in operation from 11th November 2012 until 31st December 2012 but will only have effect in relation to such part or parts of the lengths of road as are indicated by the appropriate traffic signs.

The Order does not apply to vehicles being used to carry out the works, vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Alternative routes for the traffic affected by the Order during the prohibition will be signposted. Detailed descriptions can be obtained at Scotland TransServ, Broxden House, Broxden Business Park, Lamberkine Drive, Perth, PH1 1RA.
