ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A99 (South Road, Wick) (Temporary Prohibition of
Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2012**

Made - - - - - *6th June 2012*
Coming into force - - - - - *18th June 2012*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be prohibited from waiting, loading or unloading because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said length of road.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A99 (South Road, Wick) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2012, comes into force on 18th June 2012 and ceases to have effect on 2nd July 2012.

Temporary prohibition

2. No person may cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load or unload at any time on the length of road, or a part or parts of the length of road, specified in the Schedule to this Order when such a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or to a part or parts of that length of road, by means of traffic signs prescribed in Diagrams 636 and 636.1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

Exemptions

3. This Order does not apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (inserted by the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991, Schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by the S.I. 2001/1400) as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c.54). The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

4. This Order does not apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

That length of the A99 Latheron – Wick Trunk Road from its junction with March Road, Wick northwards to its junction with Thurso Street, Wick, a distance of 1.040 kilometres or thereby.

PRESS NOTICE

THE A99 (SOUTH ROAD, WICK) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING) ORDER 2012

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily prohibiting traffic from waiting, loading or unloading on that length of the A99 Latheron – Wick Trunk Road from its junction with March Road, Wick northwards to its junction with Thurso Street, Wick, a distance of 1.040 kilometres or thereby.

The Order, which is required because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the length of road, will be in operation from 18th June 2012 until 2nd July 2012 but will only have effect in relation to such part or parts of the length of road as is indicated by the appropriate traffic signs.

The Order does not apply to vehicles being used to carry out the works, vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or to acts done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.
