The A702 Trunk Road (Coulter) (30mph Speed Limit) and Coulter Primary School (Part-time 20mph Speed Limit) Variation Order 2009

Made

13th November 2009

Coming into force

18th November 2009

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 82(2)(a), 83(1), 84(1)(a) and (c) and 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

They have complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A702 Trunk Road (Coulter) (30mph Speed Limit) and Coulter Primary School (Part-time 20mph Speed Limit) Variation Order 2009 and comes into force on 18th November 2009.

Direction that a length of road ceases to be a restricted road

2. It is directed that the lengths of road specified in schedules 1 and 2 to this Order cease to be restricted roads for the purpose of section 81 of the 1984 act.

Restrictions of Speed

- 3. (1) Subject to paragraph (2), no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 mph on the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- (2) no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 mph on the length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order when such speed limit applies to that length of road in accordance with paragraph (3).
- (3) A 20 mph speed limit applies to that length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order when such speed limit is indicated by means of a traffic sign prescribed in diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002 (c)

SCHEDULE 1

Length of Road to which 30 mph Speed Limit applies.

That length of the A702 Edinburgh to Abington Trunk Road at Coulter from a point 275 metres or thereby north of the centre line with the junction of Coulter Square to a point 423 metres or thereby south west of the junction centre line with Birthwood Road, a distance of 1.15 kilometres or thereby.

SCHEDULE 2

Length of Road to which 20 mph Part Time Speed Limit applies.

That length of the A702 Edinburgh to Abington Trunk Road at Coulter from a point 70 metres or thereby north of the centre line of the junction with Birthwood Road to a point 85 metres or thereby south west of the centre line of the junction with Birthwood Road, a distance of 144 metres or thereby.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Trunk Roads (Restricted Roads) (Lanarkshire) (Variation) Order 1996 and shall come into force on 18th October 1996.
- 2. For paragraph 4(a) of the Schedule to the Truek Roads (Restricted Roads) (Lanarkshire) Order 1975(d) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:-
 - "4(a) at Coulter from a point 350 yards or thereby south west of the junction with Birthwood Road (formerly Birthwood Highway) in a north easterly direction to a point 300 yards or thereby north of the junction with Coulterhaugh Road (formerly Coulterhaugh Highway)."

The Trunk Roads (Restricted Roads) (Lanarkshire) Order 1975

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 72(3) and 73(1)(a) and (2) and \$200(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967(a) as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968(b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and having complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure)(Scotland) Regulations 1973(c), the Secretary of State hereby directs as follows:

- 1. This order may be cited as the Trunk Roads (Restricted Roads) (Lanarkshire) Order 1975 and shall come into operation on 1975.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of this order and the order hereby revoked as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 7. The Prunk Roads (Restricted Roads) (Scotland) (No 1; Order 1962(e) is hereby revoked.
- h. At 11.59 pm on 14th by 1975 each of the hongths of road specified in the Schedule to this order shall cense to be a resoluted road for the purpose of section 71(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended (which imposes a speed limit of 30 m.p.h. on a restricted road).
- 5. At 00.01 am on 15th key 1975 each of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this order shall become a restricted road for the purpose of section 71(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended (which imposes a speed limit of 30 m.p.h. on a restricted road).

- 1. That length of the Edinburgh-Glasgow Trunk Road (Route A5) at Baillieston in the County of Lanark from a point 15 yards or thereby west of the centre line of Swinton Highway eastwards to a point 40 yards or thereby east of the centre line of Bavenswood Road a distance of 390 yards or thereby.
- 2. The Abington-Lanark-Airdrie Trunk Road (Route A73) in the County of Lanark:-
 - (a) At Chapelhall from a point 100 yards or thereby north of the junction with Burniebrae Highway (C71) in a southerly direction to a point 35 yards or thereby south of the junction with Main Street;
