ROAD TRAFFIC

The A725/A726 Trunk Road (Strathclyde Business Park) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2010

Made	10th August 2010
Coming into Force	23rd August 2010

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 1(1) of that Act, they consider it expedient to do so for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

They have complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987 (b).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A725/A726 Trunk Road (Strathclyde Business Park) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2010 and comes into force on 23rd August 2010.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. Subject to Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall use, or cause or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule.

Permission or direction of Police Constable

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Exemption for emergency vehicles

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

That length of the northbound off-ramp of the A725/A726 Shawhead - East Kilbride – Phillipshill Roundabout Trunk Road to the Strathclyde Business Park, Bellshill, from a point "A", where the western kerbline of the northbound off-ramp intersects with the western kerbline of the northbound A725 trunk road, to a point "B", 114 metres or thereby east of the intersection of the extended east kerbline of Dove Wynd and the extended south kerbline of Phoenix Crescent, a distance of 278 metres or thereby as shown on the plan numbered 06/SW/1101/030/001 entitled "The A725/A726 Trunk Road (Strathclyde Business Park) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2010".

PART 2

All left turns into the road which links James Street with Phoenix Crescent at the entry to the Strathclyde Business Park, Bellshill from the northbound off-ramp of the A725/A726 Shawhead - East Kilbride – Phillipshill Roundabout Trunk Road.
