**The A889 Trunk Road (Dalwhinnie) (40mph Speed Limit)
Order 202[]**

Coming into force - - []

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 84(1)(a) and 124(1)(d) of, and paragraph 27 of schedule 9 of, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 84(2)(b) of that Act, they have given public notice of their intention to make the following Order, and have complied with Parts II and III of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(c).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A889 Trunk Road (Dalwhinnie) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 202[] and comes into force on [].

Speed limit

2. No person may drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the length of road specified in the schedule.

Revocation

3. Paragraph 4 of the schedule of the Trunk Roads (40mph Speed Limit) (Inverness-shire) (Consolidation) Order 1974 (d) is revoked.

Exemption

4. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to—

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (c. 27) (inserted by the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (c. 22) ("the 1991 Act"), schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by S.I. 2001/1400) as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c. 54) (relevantly amended by S.I. 2001/1400). The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c. 46).

SCHEDULE

Article 2

SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A889 Dalwhinnie - Laggan Bridge Trunk Road from a point 769 metres or thereby south of its intersection with the extended centreline of Station Road, Dalwhinnie, in a generally northerly direction to a point 826 metres or thereby north of its intersection with the extended centreline of Station Road, Dalwhinnie, a distance of 1.595 kilometres or thereby.
