Procuring rail passenger services

Caledonian Sleeper

37. Should we continue to specify sleeper services, or should this be a purely commercial matter for a train operating company?

Q37 comments: The Landmark Trust is a building preservation charity that rescues historic or architecturally important buildings that are then made available for all to rent as holiday accommodation. We have many buildings in Scotland and many of our guests use your sleeper services to access them. We would prefer you to continue specifying sleeper services.

38. Should the Caledonian Sleeper services be contracted for separately from the main ScotRail franchise? Or should it be an option for within the main ScotRail franchise?

Q38 comments: As our guests will use other ScotRail services to complete their journeys we would prefer the contract kept with the main franchise.

- 39 We would be interested in your views in the level and type of service that the Caledonian Sleeper Services should provide. Including:
- What is the appeal of the Caledonian Sleeper Service, and if there were more early and late trains would the appeal of the sleeper services change?
- What is the value of sleeper services to Fort William, Inverness and Aberdeen and are these the correct destinations, for example would Oban provide better connectivity?
- What facilities should the sleeper services provide and would you pay more for better facilities?

The appeal of the Sleeper Service is the ability to get to the extreme corners of Scotland first thing in the morning which is frequently impossible except by driving over night. Earlier trains would appeal as one frequently has to wait many hours in London before being able to catch the sleeper and thereby missing out on day light hours in Scotland. Oban would be an excellent additional destination however Inverness is an essential destination for our guests especially as it allows them to continue to Orkney.

Apart from Wifi and a good breakfast there are no other services we would find essential. The current arrangements provide good value for money and additional payment for better facilities would be acceptable.
