measure which will allow more time for measured dialogue between both parties.

The Moray Council supports this proposal. Placing a requirement on bus operators to consult rather than merely notify on future commercial network changes will offer more opportunity for a collaborative approach in developing bus services which meet customer
needs.

There is the potential for chaotic service implementation dates in some parts of the country if 42 days were to be accepted for electronic registrations (EBSR) and 56 days for manually prepared documentation.
