## ROAD TRAFFIC

The A9 Trunk Road (Bankfoot) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2009

Made
Coming into force

11<sup>th</sup> June 2009 25<sup>th</sup> June 2009

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1(1), sections 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 1(1), it appears to them that it is expedient to make this Order for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other roads specified in Parts 1 and 3 of the Schedule to this Order or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

They have complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b).

## Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A9 Trunk Road (Bankfoot) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2009 and comes into force on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2009.

## Prohibition of use of vehicles

- 2. Subject to Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall use, or cause or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in:
- (a) Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order; and

(b) Part 3 of the Schedule to this Order so as to make any turn specified in Part 4 of the Schedule to this Order, provided that the said prohibitions shall apply only to the part or parts of the said length of road by means of traffic signs as prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(a).

## **Direction of Police Constable**

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

# Exemption for emergency vehicles

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for ambulance or police purposes or for or in connection with the exercise of any function of a relevant authority (as defined in section 6 of the Fire (Scotland) Act 2005(b)).

#### SCHEDULE

## PART 1

That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road from a point 670 metres or thereby north of the northwest corner of Hunters Lodge Bridge carrying the C408 under the M9/A9 Trunk Road southwards then southeastwards to a point 300 metres or thereby northwest of the extended centreline of the access road to Westwood Farm, Bankfoot, a distance of 2.25 kilometres or thereby.

#### PART 2

All U turns on the length of M9/A9 Trunk Road specified in Part 1 of this Schedule.

#### PART 3

- 1. That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh Stirling Thurso Trunk Road from a point 135 metres or thereby north of the northwest corner of Hunters Lodge Bridge carrying the C408 under the M9/A9 Trunk Road northwards to a point 390 metres or thereby north of the northwest corner of Hunters Lodge Bridge carrying the C408 under the M9/A9 Trunk Road, a distance of 255 metres or thereby.
- 2. That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh Stirling Thurso Trunk Road from a point 16 metres or thereby north of the extended northeast gable of the property known as Hilton Bungalow, Bankfoot southwards to a point 232 metres or thereby south of the extended northeast gable of the property known as Hilton Bungalow, Bankfoot, a distance of 248 metres or thereby.

## PART 4

All right turns onto and off, and straight ahead manoeuvres across the lengths of M9/A9 Trunk Road specified in Part 3 of this Schedule.

THE SCOTTISH MINISTERS hereby give notice that on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2009 they made the above Order under section 1(1), sections 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Order comes into force on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2009.
