Commonwealth Games

7. Raymond Conville presented a paper on the Commonwealth games 2014 Bid Commitments which asked the Board to note the experiences / lessons learnt from the Delhi Games and what Transport Scotland's role would be in the 2014 games. The Board discussed the introduction of 38 new class 380 trains which will provide an additional 7,500 seats to the Network; Transport Scotland's work with SPT on the Clyde Fastlink scheme; and Trunk Road Network improvements. The Board agreed with the work that has been carried out so far, and welcomed a future update on commitments to and potential involvement in the Games.
