Minutes of previous meeting, action point tracker and matters arising

2. The minutes of the meeting on 22 November were agreed.

Summary Progress Report of key issues

3. The Board noted the summary report and discussed the current position regarding derogation of drivers' hours, salt stocks and climate change contributions.

Corporate Stats

4. The Board noted the position with corporate stats on correspondence, PQ's and FOI's and the need for officials to continue to meet the corporate deadlines on these.

Transport and Winter Resilience Update

5. The Board discussed the recent bad weather and subsequent disruption to the transport network which led to the resignation of Stewart Stevenson as Transport Minister. Keith Brown MSP had now been appointed as the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure. The recently announced 6 point plan and resilience of the rail network were also discussed. The Board noted that additional resources had been deployed to assist the teams answering the increased correspondence around these topics.

6. Sharon Fairweather outlined the main aspects from the finance report and the Board had a discussion around current finance issues.

Rail Review Update

7. David Middleton informed the Board that the arrangements were now in place for the revised rail structure within Transport Scotland and passed on his thanks for the work that had gone into making this happen.
