2	Safety Procedures	All parties confirmed that there were no health and safety issues to report.	

3	Notes of Traffic Management Meeting No 11	All parties confirmed that the notes from TMWG Meeting Number 11 were an accurate account of the discussions held.	
4	General	<ol> <li>EDT confirmed the baseline traffic monitoring results, in the form of location plans and tabulated results continued to be uploaded to the FRC website. 		<ol> <li>TMWG discussed FETAs' programme of ongoing works – no new conflicts identified with other works.</li> </ol>	
		<ol> <li>Events Calendar – TMWG discussed calendar and provided the following update.</li> </ol>	
		Olympic Torch - It was noted that lengthy queues on the road network may occur as a result of the Olympic Torch procession. It was further noted that the footways over the existing Forth Road Bridge would be closed in advance of, and during, the procession crossing the bridge.	
		4) Delay Management – No issues identified	
		<ol> <li>Winter Service – Scheduled to finish today (15<sup>th</sup> May), re- commencing on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2012.</li> </ol>	
		6) It was noted that pavement condition surveys as part of the M9 Spur Contract. Maintenance Period are required to be undertaken by third parties. The programme for these investigations is expected shortly from CEC. The investigation may conflict with the TM arrangement installed as part of the M9 Junction 1a contract. Site teams to coordinate and mitigate.

5	Principal Contract	<ol> <li>FCBC confirmed that a Cat 1 defect (pothole on A904) was repaired on the morning of 11 May 2012. Further repairs to take place on the night of 15<sup>th</sup> May 2012 on A904 and B924.</li> </ol>	FCBC
		<ol> <li>No complaints in respect of TM have been received in the past month.</li> </ol>	
		<ol> <li>FCBC confirmed a letter drop will take place for the blasting at Whinny Hill.</li> </ol>	
		4) 3 month look ahead – <u>North</u>	FCBC
		St Margarets Hope rock blasting – FCBC confirmed that blasts are scheduled at St. Margarets Hope and Pier N2 over next 4 weeks. There will be stop/go boards in place on B981 during the time of the blasts with a wait time of approx. 10 mins.	

		<ul> <li>There will be a rolling road block at Castlandhill (A90 SB), traffic lights will be used to hold A90 NB traffic at FRB and holding of traffic at King Malcolm Drive for blasting at Whinny Hill. Blasting will commence 18/05 every 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday for 6 months. Blast will take place at 10pm. FCBC confirmed that following the blast, vehicles would drive through the closed sections to ensure that the carriageway was clear prior to opening to general traffic.</li> <li><u>South</u></li> <li>The B924 &amp; A904 will have single lane closures 15th May to repair potholes; this should be completed by midnight.</li> <li>Society Road full night-time closure to install drain crossing planned for 21<sup>st</sup> &amp; 22<sup>nd</sup> May PM.</li> <li>U221 Daytime TM to carry out trial holes in verge - no restrictions to traffic.</li> <li>A90 Dalmeny – single lane closure to carry out inspection of existing structure 16<sup>th</sup> &amp; 17<sup>th</sup> June (night-time). 		2) JG reported 9 breakdowns in April and 4 in May to date.	
		3) JG reported to the TMWG that there were 3 incidents in May. The first was an HGV colliding with a vehicle - no injuries. Two separate incidents on A823 S/B merge, vehicles hit TM cones - left site without notifying anyone. Both incidents occurred on 10 <sup>th</sup> May and weather conditions may have been a probable cause.	
		<ol> <li>JG confirmed courtesy letters were issued on 19<sup>th</sup> April to affected parties showing sketch of route used for gantry delivery.</li> </ol>	
		5) TMWG congratulated JG for their efforts with the re-surfacing	EDT
		works, works undertaken in 2 weekends, 4 weekends originally programmed. EDT confirmed that they expected to release a press statement, thanking the public for heeding the message.	JG

		• TMWG agreed that no lifting of gantries would take place adjacent to live traffic to avoid driver distraction. JG to consider the use of screens, where appropriate.	JG
		• Lane closures would commence at approximately 8pm with rolling blocks not utilised until approximately midnight.	
		• JG to further develop proposals and to discuss with consultees, details of ADS installation on gantries also to be provided.	
		• TfS propose to pre-sign works approximately 3-4 days in advance of works taking place. JG to provide a minimum of 10 days notice to permit TfS to pre-plan.

SRB to assess need for further rolling block on M9 Spur SB during lift of beams from storage area. SRB confirmed that beams would be stored on an open trailer, parked on the hardshoulder of the M9 Spur NB.	SRB
		M9 Overbridge – South Span installation –- M9 EB &WB reduced to 1 lane. Rolling block undertaken on both M9 EB &

SRB to confirm resourcing for rolling blocks.</li> <li>M9 Central Reserve – SRB presented proposals for placing varioguard in central reserve of the M9 between the M9 Spur and the B9080. Access to works would be via a pedestrian only access during the daytime from the B9080 Overbridge,</li> </ul>	
		with night-time vehicular access. Woks to be undertaken – June/July.	
		M9 Spur – Loop Cutting on northern section – August 2012. Phase 1: install loops in hardshoulder and lane 1. Phase 2: install loops in lane 2. All works undertaken under TM with a 40mph speed limit in place.	
		M9 Spur Northbound – Existing average speed camera to be moved and extent of varioguard reduced to the north of Falkirk to Fife Railway line.
