ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A6091 Trunk Road (Borders General Hospital Junction)
(Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2011**

Made - - - - *1st December 2011*

Coming into force - - *12th December 2011*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 1(1) of that Act, they consider it expedient to make this Order to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or to prevent the likelihood of any such danger arising.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A6091 Trunk Road (Borders General Hospital Junction) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2011 and comes into force on 12th December 2011.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. No person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule to make the turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule.

Direction of Police Constable

3. Nothing in this Order applies to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (inserted by the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (c.22), Schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by the Scotland Act 1998 (Consequential Modifications) Order 2001 (S.I. 2001/1400)) as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c.54). The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or a vehicle being used for carrying out the works

Article 2

PART 1

That length of the unclassified road D16/4 at its junction with the A6091/A7 Melrose – Galashiels – Carlisle Trunk Road at Borders General Hospital.

PART 2

All right turns from the unclassified road D16/4 into the eastbound carriageway of the A6091/A7 Melrose – Galashiels – Carlisle Trunk Road at Borders General Hospital.
