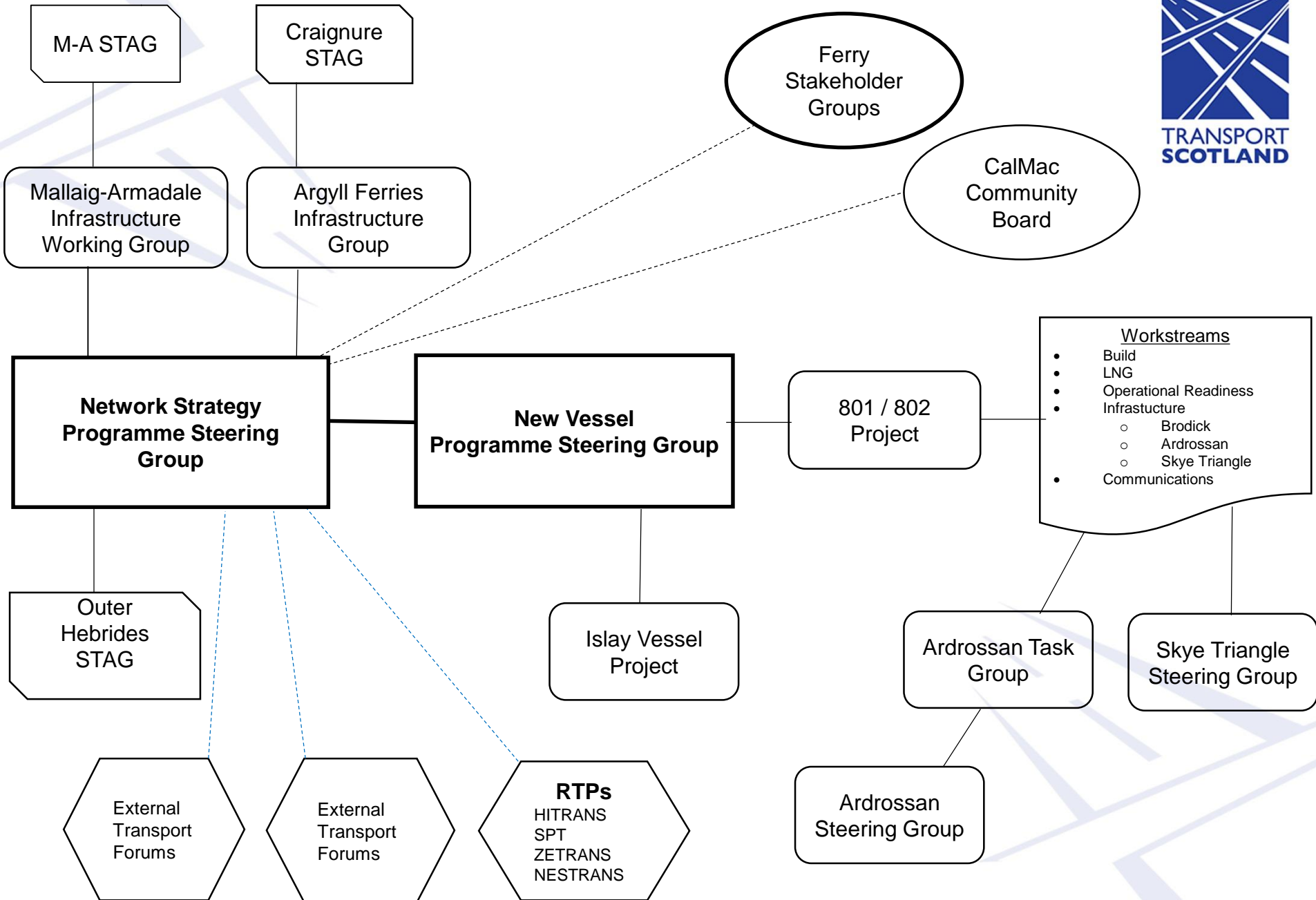

Network Strategy

Vessel Replacement and Deployment Plan (VRDP)

- Baseline carryings and capacity data from CalMac
- Economic forecasts (consultant) converted into demand forecasts (CFL)
- Forecasts based on unconstrained demand
- CalMac model shows forecast demand against planned capacity (averaged)
- Informs decisions on vessel investment priorities
