# Introduction

Moving freight by rail rather than road can seem like a daunting task but is achievable. It can offer a new and exciting way to move goods, which can help towards reducing carbon emissions, something that is good for you, your customer and the planet.

Working together, Freight Operating Companies or dedicated multi modal shift logistic groups can carry out long hauls whilst hauliers undertake the drop off/collection at either end of a process.

#### Freight operating companies

Freight Operating Companies (FOCs) provide train services for moving goods by rail. FOC's can provide locomotives, wagons, qualified staff, information and planning services to help hauliers move goods by rail. They can also offer general advice and a more detailed consultancy service for all aspects of rail-based freight development

#### **Dedicated logistics companies**

They can provide the same service as FOCs. The majority of dedicated logistic companies are initially from a road haulage background and consequently have an understanding of the industry's needs. Dedicated logistic companies can arrange for the movement of goods on your behalf by rail. They can also offer a door-to-door service, which would include the road legs involved within any movement.

#### Simple action plan

- 1. Contact FOC/logistics provider to discuss the movement of goods (including how much, what it is, where it is to go and timings).
- 2. FOC's/logistics provider will work out if the project is viable, costs etc.
- 3. Once an agreement has been reached, a contract is drawn up and the goods are moved by rail rather than road.
