The A87 Trunk Road (Invergarry) (40mph Speed Limit) Variation and
Invergarry Primary School (Part-time 20mph Speed Limit) Order 2006

24th March 2006

Coming into force

7th April 2006

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 84(1)(a) and (c) as read with section 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, and having complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b), hereby make the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A87 Trunk Road (Invergarry) (40mph Speed Limit) Variation and Invergarry Primary School (Part-time 20mph Speed Limit) Order 2006 and shall come into force on 7th April 2006.

Variation of the Trunk Roads (Route A87) (Invergarry) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 1982

2. (1) The Trunk Roads (Route A87) (Invergarry) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 1982(c) is varied in accordance with the following paragraphs.
- (2) In article 2 at the beginning insert "Subject to article 2A below,"
- (3) In article 2 for "the Schedule" substitute "Schedule 1"

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (c.27) (inserted by the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (c.22), Schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by the Scotland Act 1998 (Consequential Modifications) Order 2001 (S.I. 2001/1400)), as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c.54). The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by the Scotland Act 1998 (Transfer of Functions to the Scottish Ministers etc.) Order 1999 (S.I. 1999/1750).


(4) After article 2 insert—

“2A – (1) No person shall drive any motor vehicle on the length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order at a speed exceeding 20mph when such speed limit applies to that length of road in accordance with paragraph (2).

(2) A 20mph speed limit applies to the length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order when a 20mph speed limit is indicated by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(a).”

(5) The Schedule is renumbered as Schedule 1.

(6) After the Schedule to the Order insert the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE 2

That length of the A87 Invergarry - Kyle of Lochalsh - Borve - Uig Trunk Road at Invergarry from a point 60 metres or thereby east of the extended east kerbline of Garry Crescent westwards to a point 145 metres or thereby west of the extended east kerbline of Garry Crescent, a distance of 205 metres or thereby.


