THE A9 TRUNK ROAD (TOMATIN TO MOY) (TRUNKING) ORDER 2021

The Scottish Ministers hereby give notice that they propose to make the following Orders in connection with improving, and constructing a new grade separated junction of, the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road between Tomatin and Moy in the County of Inverness-shire:-

a. the A9 Trunk Road (Tomatin to Moy) (Trunking) Order 2021, an Order under section 5(2) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 to provide for new lengths of trunk road to form part of the existing trunk road; and

b. the A9 Trunk Road (Tomatin to Moy) (Side Roads) Order 2021, an Order under sections 12(1) and (5) and 70(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 to construct new side roads, improve existing roads, provide for the stopping up of various existing roads and private accesses and the provision of certain new means of access.

In accordance with the Coronavirus (Scotland) Act 2020, Schedule 6, Part 3, para 9, the proposed Orders and Plans will not be available for inspection at public display locations. Any person aggrieved and who desires to question the validity of the Order on the grounds that they are not within the powers of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 or that any requirement of that Act has not been complied with, may within 6 weeks of 26th February 2021 make an application to the Court of Session for the suspension of, or the quashing of, the Orders or any provision contained therein.
