# What is the pilot scheme?

People who are seeking asylum and live in Scotland can apply for free bus travel through this pilot scheme. The scheme is accessed using a National Entitlement Card (NEC).

The scheme will run from 1 December 2025 to 31 March 2026, but may end earlier if funding runs out. If this happens, we will write to cardholders and update advice on our website.

# Who is eligible?

If you are seeking asylum in Scotland, you are eligible to apply for free bus travel.

If you are under 22, over 60, or have a disability you can already use the existing statutory schemes. Please contact your local council to find out more.

# How to apply

The scheme will begin on 1 December 2025. Applications should be made through your local council. You should allow at least 2 weeks to receive your card.

If you need help with your application, you can contact your Mears representative or local charities in your area that support people seeking asylum.

# What you need to apply

To apply for the pilot scheme, you need to show proof of your asylum status. You can use one of the following documents:

- Application Registration Card (ARC)
- BAIL201 form

You will also need to provide:

- Your name
- Your address
- · Your date of birth
- A clear photo of your face

# Renewing or replacing your card

Contact your local council if:

- your card is lost, stolen or damaged
- your card did not work when you used the ticket machine
- you want to change your name, address or photo

If you move to a different council area you must also notify your new council.

#### **End date**

The scheme is temporary and will run from 1 December 2025 to 31 March 2026. Funding for the scheme is limited and so it may finish early. If this happens, Transport Scotland will send you a letter to let you know.

# Using your card

Using your card on the bus is simple. Just tell the driver where you are going and show them your card, including the photo. Then, place your card on the ticket machine. You do not need to tap your card when you get off the bus.

Only use the newest version of your card. If your card does not work, you will need to pay for your bus ticket and request a replacement.

# Where can you travel

Your card gives you free travel across most local and long-distance bus services in Scotland. It is not valid on premium night buses, tours/excursions, and group hire services. Contact the transport operator before travelling if you have any questions.
