

# Appendix E – Stakeholder and Landowner Information

## Land Interest Questionnaire Comments

Route	Comments related to route options and impact of route options on respondent's property
Purple Route	Landowner has 12 mature trees to the front of their property and would not want the route to impact them.
Purple Route	People regularly walk on the path to the rear of the property which is very narrow and not suitable for cycling.
Purple Route	How near to boundary would cycle track come?
Purple Route	The issue of the bike paths etc needs to be addressed in a proportionate way and a holistic manner.
Blue Route	Although there is no indication showing where the path is to be, I would assume it will be on my side of the road?
Purple Route	Kinchurdy Road not appropriate for cycle path. Farm traffic , trucks, cars etc. Already far too many poorly behaved cyclists.
Blue Route	I have looked at the two options: Corridor 3 and Corridor 6. My strong preference would be for Corridor 3. This would link Kinveachy to Avielochan and Aviemore. The additional length of Corridor 6 renders it impractical. Corridor 3 could be rendered scenic/ recreation friendly by setting it a short distance back from the A95.
Blue Route	Both properties are holiday cottages. Unwilling to sell land for use of NMU route but is in favour of the project.
Purple Route	If this goes ahead will there be more bikes using this road?
Purple Route	I believe there are other more suitable routes for the ACNMU than via Kinchurdy Road. Kinchurdy Road is relatively narrow for a road with housing boundaries right up to the road. There is not any room to have a separate cycle belt separate from the road. Other more suitable routes would be through the road from Boat of Garten Yard, or from Carrbridge to entrance to the woods via entrance to loch var. They would be prettier than the Kinchurdy Road. Moreover, these routes are commonly used by walkers and cyclists at present and it would have greater effect on the Capercaillie population than now.
Purple Route	We have seen a substantial increase in motor traffic along Kinchurdy Road. Cycle traffic has also increased hugely.
Purple Route	It is unclear what is it likely to be made of our property. Would like to know this.
