Low Carbon Travel and Transport Hubs

“Hub” – Dictionary Definitions

“The central part of a wheel, rotating on or with the axle, and from which the spokes radiate”

“The effective centre of an activity, region, or network”

“A central airport or other transport facility from which many services operate”

“A centre of activity – a focal point”

ERDF overview

- Basic Principles
 - focus on outcome / result
 - costs predominantly **capital** and **procured**
 - some scope for revenue type costs
eg. marketing & promotion, community engagement, evaluation
 - compliance and regulations

Low Carbon Travel and Transport Hubs

ERDF overview

- Funding
 - TS allocated £25m ERDF 2014 -2020
 - Total Project Costs £62.5m
 - Phase 1 – by December 2018 - investment of £8m / attracting £12m match
 - Bid for match: up to 40% in LUPS (Lowland and Upland Scotland); and
 - up to 50% in Highlands & Islands (H&I)

TS Challenge Fund



- Indicative timeline
 - procurement of contractor (Summer 2016)
 - launch of fund (Autumn 2016)
 - application / assessment process
 - award (aim for January 2017)

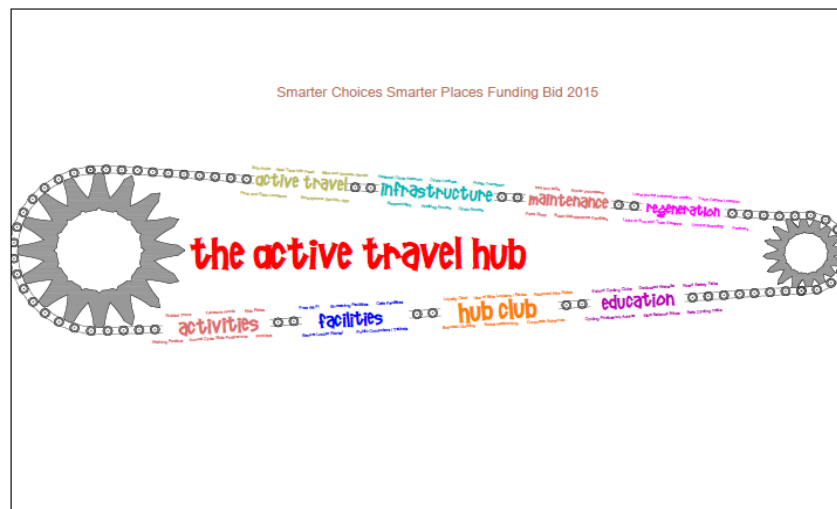
TS Targets for programme

- By end of 2018
 - 4 Hubs in LUPS area / 2 Hubs in H&I area
 - 63km associated paths
 - Increase in ULEV registrations in Scotland by 50
- By end of 2020
 - 15 Hubs in LUPS area / 5 Hubs in H&I area
 - 100km associated paths
 - Increase in ULEV Registrations in Scotland by 200

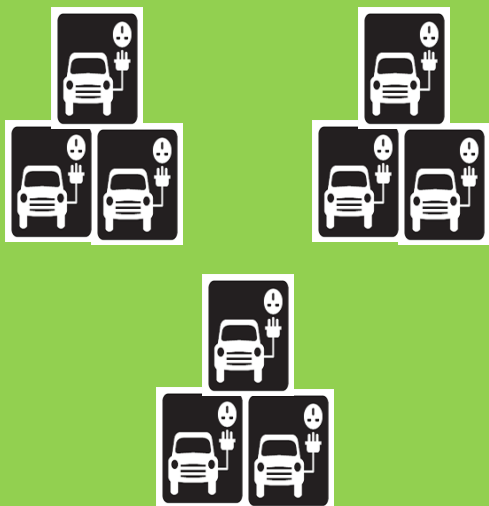
Hub A - Single Site / Single Fuel



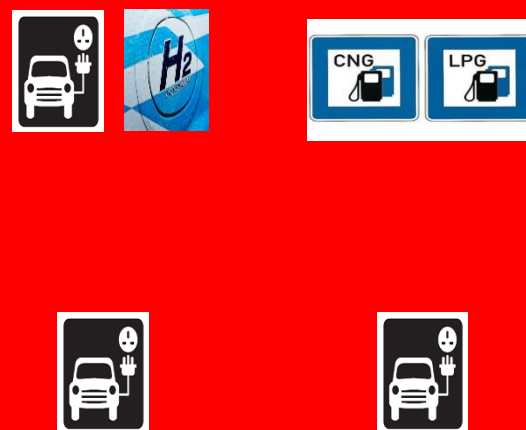
Hub B - Single Site / Multi-Fuel
