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## **CONSULTATION QUESTIONS**

Chapte	er 2
Q2.1	Do you agree that we should amend the definition of "unable to walk or has considerable difficulty walking" so that it is consistent with that used for the Higher Rate of the Mobility Component of the Disability Living Allowance assessments?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  MACS agrees that consistency is key – for reason of fairness, this seems a reasonable approach to take.
Q2.2	Do you agree that we should extend eligibility to severely disabled service personnel and war veterans?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  However, there is an understanding that most in this category would qualify under the automatic criteria.  Consistency with the system in England would be appropriate, and there should also be provision made for those who have served in EU services but are now resident in the UK, since the Blue Badge is EU recognised.
Q2.3	Do you agree that we should extend eligibility to those with severe forms of autistic spectrum disorder and very advanced forms of dementia?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  It is important to be aware of the difficulties in assessing these conditions, as those affected are likely to have "good days" and "bad days". Also, the definition of "most severe cases" is vital.  Again, it is possible that cases would already be covered under automatic criteria.

Q3.1	Do you agree that we should encourage independent medical assessments?								
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason								
	Again, consistency is key, in order to ensure fairness throughout all local authorities. It is of course vital that appropriately qualified professionals carry out the assessments, i.e. physiotherapists, occupational therapists, and not necessarily GPs.								
	There will be cost issues to consider.								
Q3.2	Should independent medical assessments be mandatory on all local authorities?								
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  Again, MACS agrees this would ensure a consistent approach. In the first instance, it may be necessary to recommend this as "Best Practice", due to the need for changes to the Act.								
Q3.3	Do you agree that an appeals process relating to the application procedure should be introduced?								
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  While MACS agrees that an appeals process should be established, some clarification is required – i.e. would the appeal be against the local authority or the independent assessor?

Q4.1	Do you agree that local authorities should have the power to confiscate badges that have been cancelled and/or are being misused by a third party for their own benefit?							
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason							
	While MACS agrees with this proposal, clarification as to who exactly these powers will be extended to would be helpful. Strong safeguards are essential to ensure such powers are not abused.							
	In addition, MACS would like to see the Badge returned quickly to its rightful owner if it has been misused without their knowledge.							
Q4.2	Do you agree that we should remove the current "three relevant convictions" requirement in the legislation and allow local authorities to make an informed judgement?							
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason							
	A clear and detailed Code of Practice and robust guidance are essential here to ensure consistency across the different local authorities.							
Q4.3	Do you agree that we should introduce maximum fine of £2,500 for the misuse of a Blue Badge?

Q5.1	Do you agree that we should move towards the central distribution of badges to improve the security of the badge?							
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason							

Q5.2	Would you like to see the badge holder's photograph on the front of the badge?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  MACS does not agree with this measure for reasons of the security, personal safety and vulnerability of the badge holder.  A suggestion to aid enforcement is to print the serial number on both sides of the Badge.
Chapter	6
Q6.1	Do you agree that local authorities should share data to assist with the administration of the Scheme?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  This would be beneficial in terms of consistency, long term cost effectiveness, the potential for storing digital photographs of the Badge owner and moving forward to centrally issued Badges in general. Privacy and security safeguards are essential as regards data protection implications.
Q6.2	Do you think we should impose a fixed penalty on badge holders who fail to return an expired badge?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  MACS agrees with this measure so long as the Badge holder has been given fair warning by reminder letters. It would be helpful if Badges could be returned to, for example, post offices or local council offices.  Badge design could be amended to incorporate the information that the Badge remains the property of the issuing authority and should be returned to them when expired/found etc.

Q6.3	Do you think we should make it mandatory for all authorities to charge a fee of £20 for every application?
YES	MACS agrees with this in principle, because of the need for consistency. However we believe there should be some conditions in place. Those in receipt of certain benefits should not be required to pay. And on renewing a Blue Badge, if personal circumstances have not changed since the last application, there should be no charge.  Difficulty arises because of the perceived benefits of holding a Blue Badge. For instance, in Edinburgh where parking charges are considerable, there is financial benefit to be gained in using a Badge for free on-street parking. However, in North Lanarkshire there is no charge for on-street parking, therefore the financial advantage gained by holding a badge is less significant.
Q6.4	Do you think we should also charge a fee of £20 for a replacement badge?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  MACS understands there has been a degree of misunderstanding with this question as some may believe this £20 charge applies to a renewal on expiry of a Blue Badge. However, there is a consensus that if a Badge is misplaced then there should be a charge to have it replaced.
Q6.5	Do you think we should raise the maximum fee to above £20?
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  Such an increase could only be considered after the issue of realistic charging for the administration and enforcement of the Blue Badge scheme has been addressed. The cost of administration at the moment may be due to poor processes which should not be passed on to those applying for a

Badge.

Q7.1	Do you agree that each Organisational Badge should contain the vehicle registration number?							
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason							
	MACS agrees in principle, however it is important to consider what would happen if a vehicle was off the road, or if a vehicle was changed every year or every other year.							
	Also, at present there are organisations which share a Badge between several vehicles – would they be required to apply for a badge for each vehicle, thus risking an increase in the amount of organisational badges in circulation?							
Q7.2	Do you agree that organisations applying for an Organisational Badge should provide proof that the vehicle has a Road License awarded under the Disabled Passenger Vehicle Taxation Class?							
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason							
	Again, MACS agrees in principle. But we are aware that some organisations have vehicles that can be used by disabled people but which do not have DPVT class and this would have to be addressed.							
Q7.3	Do you agree that we should alter the design of an Organisational Badge to make it easily identifiable?							
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason

Q8.1	Do you agree that we should remove the right to park on double yellow lines?									
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  The general consensus at MACS is that Blue Badge holders would at present park on double yellow lines only as a last resort. We would support this measure only if sufficient disabled parking bays are in place, established through use of audits if necessary. The onus should be placed on employers to ensure there is adequate parking for disabled employees. Consistency and fairness are key, as ever, as well as road safety for all. It would be helpful to provide Badge holders with better guidance on their rights and responsibilities.									
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Q8.3	Would you like to see research carried out on the implications of removing some of the additional concessions for badge holders?								
YES	NO – Please Provide Reason  MACS recognises that this is a huge issue which should be addressed seriously. The outcome of this research is likely to require further consultation.
