ROAD TRAFFIC

The A86 Trunk Road (Newtonmore) (30mph Speed Limit) Order 2002

Made Coming into force 6th February 2002 20th February 2002

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred on them (a) by sections 82(2)(b), 83(1), 84(1)(a) and 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, and having complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(c), hereby make the following Order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the A86 Trunk Road (Newtonmore) (30mph Speed Limit) Order 2002 and shall come into force on 20th February 2002.
- 2. No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed exceeding 30mph on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. The Highland Regional Council Transitional Order Restricted and Non-Restricted Roads shall be varied to the effect that the paragraph relating to Route A86, Spean Bridge Kingussie Road in "Schedule: Newtonmore" thereto is deleted.
